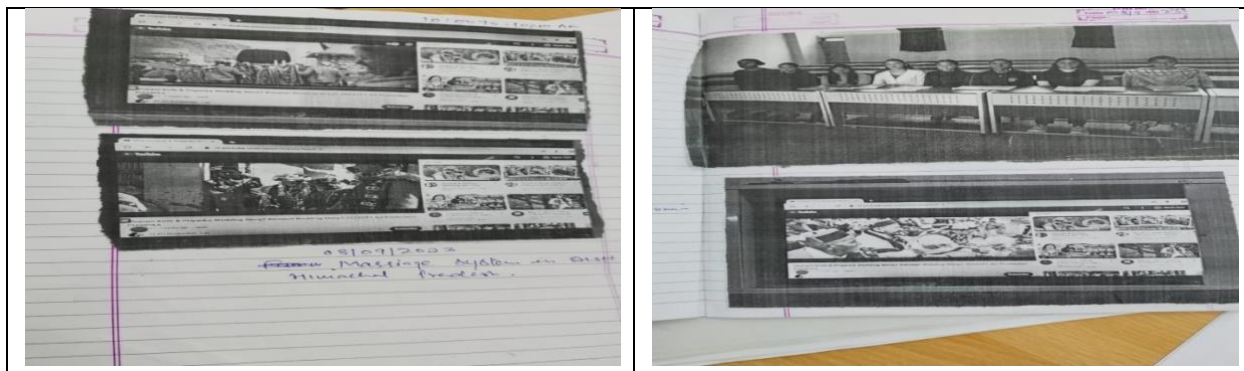




‘Department of Sociology’ Details of Activities – (2023-24)

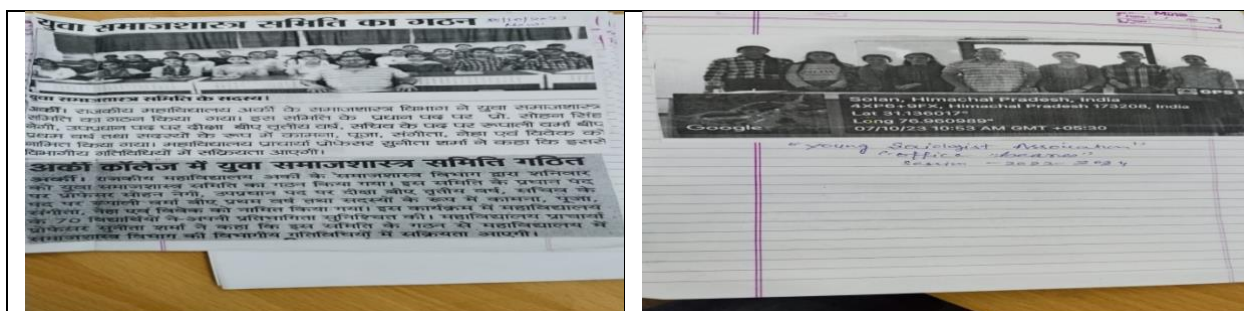
1. Date: 8.9.2023. Topic - Documentary on Marriage system in Kinnaur and Solan

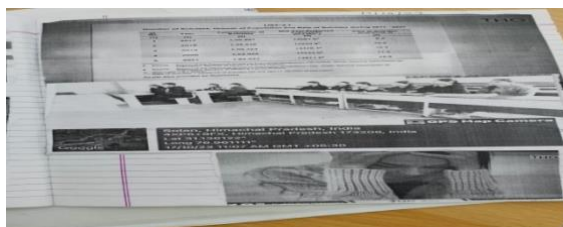
2. Date: 7.10 .23. Topic : Formation of departmental Society
