Procedure of Admission

1. Visit college website www.gcarki.hp.gov.in
2. Click on the online admission link/ student login to open it.
3. Read all the guidelines and eligibility conditions provided in the college prospectus available on the website.
4. Register yourself by clicking 'NEW REGISTRATION'/ SIGN UP tab, and note down username and password generated after registration for future reference . (Note: Provide your own working mobile No. and e-mail id only)
5. Login into your account and fill the admission form. Fill all the details carefully and only as per documents (such as matriculation and 10+2).
6. Upload your passport size photograph as well as other required documents. (Keep the soft copy of documents ready with size below 200 kb). Upload valid and correct documents only, otherwise your form will be REJECTED.
7. Submit the form, pay registration/prospectus fee of Rs. 50/- and download the PDF of the form for future reference.
8. After approval from the college admission committee, you will receive an email of approval, then pay fee online by clicking the tab 'PAY FEE'.
9. Download fee receipt and application/admission form, as you need to submit the same at the time of physical verification by concerned admission committee.

A Brief Profile

Since its inception in the year 1994, Government College Arki has proved to be an important educational landmark of District Solan and is imparting education at the undergraduate level in all the three streams, viz., Science, Humanities and Commerce under the Choice Based Credit System (CBCS). In addition to these, Bachelor of Computer Applications (BCA) - a job orientated, degree course and MA in English & History have also been introduced. Located in pristine, picturesque surroundings of BatalGhatti, just 4 km from Arki, the college offers a very conducive environment for learning and envelopes even those who have the propensity to go wayward. The college, affiliated to H.P. University - Shimla, has brought higher education to the doorsteps of every household in the vicinity. Now, the students don't need to go to other places for their higher learning.

Starting its journey on 15 July, 1994 from the campus of GSSS, Arki, initially for two months and thereafter in the temporarily modified premises of Jal Shakti Vibhag, Arki this NAAC accredited, coeducational institution has evolved as a fountain head of learning providing quality education to the students of this primarily rural area. The number of students has exponentially risen from 110 in the first batch in 1994 to about 1000 in 2023. The college was shifted to its present sprawling campus at BatalGhatti in 1998. Here, it has separate Arts, Science and Administrative Blocks. The Science-Block was constructed with a substantial amount of three crores whereas the construction of the Arts-Block was sponsored by the Gujrat Ambujaa Cement Ltd. Today, the college possesses adequate infrastructure in terms of class-rooms, laboratories, a library, a well-equipped computer lab with wi-fi connection and a playground etc. To cater to the needs of SC and ST students (only girls) a four-storeyed hostel has also been constructed. However, the journey has not come to an end here only. Keeping in view the future educational scenario the college is exploring the possibilities of offering professional courses like PGDCA, BBA, BTA & JMC etc as well as M.A. courses. That is why college is striving hard for its infrastructural expansion.

The motto of the college, which means 'We taste immortality through knowledge', reflects the vision of the founder members of the college. They were wise enough to envision that the future would belong to people believing in 'meritocracy' and not 'mediocrity'. Keeping in with this dream the students also realize in all earnestness that 'quality' and not 'quantity' is the watch-word of the time. Hence, the excellent result in the university examination year after year and other co-curricular achievements of our students proves that they are continuing the traditions set by their predecessors. INTRODUCTION TO UGC-CBCS (CHOICE BASED CREDIT SYSTEM)

Himachal Pradesh University, Shimla has adopted the UGC framework of curriculum under CBCS from the academic session 2016-17 for the purpose of ensuring uniformity in the standards of higher education and to provide the students quality education on a par with the best in India. The relevant details of the new UGC- CBCS are as follows:

The UGC-CBCS provides an opportunity for the students to choose courses from the prescribed courses comprising core, elective/minor or skill-based courses. The courses can be evaluated following the grading system, which is considered to be better than the conventional marks system. Therefore, it is necessary to introduce uniform grading system in the entire higher education in India. This will benefit the students to move across institutions within India. The uniform grading system will also enable potential employers in assessing the performance of the candidates. In order to bring uniformity in evaluation system and computation of the Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) based on student's performance in examinations, the UGC has formulated the guidelines to be followed.

Outline of Choice Based Credit System

1. **Discipline Specific Core (DSC) Course:** A course, which should compulsorily be studied by a candidate as a core requirement is termed as a Core course.
2. **Elective Course:** Generally, a course which can be chosen from a pool of courses and which may be very specific or specialized or advanced or supportive to the discipline/ subject of study or which provides an extended scope or which enables an exposure to some other discipline/subject/domain or nurtures the candidate's proficiency/skill is called an Elective Course.

Discipline Specific Elective (DSE) Course (2 each for regular courses): Elective courses may be offered by the main discipline/subject of study is referred to as Discipline Specific Elective. The University/Institute may also offer discipline related Elective courses of interdisciplinary nature (to be offered by main discipline/subject of study).

Dissertation/Project Work: An elective course of 6 credits, designed to acquire special/advanced knowledge, such as supplement study/support study to a project work, and a candidate studies such a course on his own with an advisory support by a teacher/faculty member is called dissertation/project work. A Project/Dissertation work may be given in lieu of a discipline specific elective paper.

Generic Elective Course (GEC): An elective course chosen generally from an unrelated discipline/subject, with an intention to seek exposure to other subjects/disciplines is called a Generic Elective Course.

3. **Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC)/Competency Improvement Courses/Skill Development Courses / Foundation**

Course: The Ability Enhancement (AE) Courses may be of two kinds: AE Compulsory Course (AECC) and AE Elective

Course (AEEC). "ECC" courses are the courses based upon the content that leads to Knowledge enhancement. They (i) Environmental Science, (ii) English/MIL Communication] are mandatory for all disciplines. AECC courses are value-based and/or skill-based and are aimed at providing hands-on-training, competencies, skills, etc.

Ability Enhancement Compulsory Course (AECC): Environmental Science, English Communication/MIL Communication.

Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC) (Minimum 4): These courses may be chosen from a pool of courses designed to provide value-based and/or skill-based instruction. P.S.: A core course offered in a discipline/subject may be treated as an elective by other discipline/subject and vice versa and such electives may also be referred to as Generic Elective.

Note:

A student would be generally required to undertake the Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC) pertaining to the First Elective subject selected by her/him and the nature of the under graduate degree awarded to the

candidate upon the successful completion of the course will be dependent upon it. For example, if a candidate has opted for History/Chemistry as her/his First Elective and completes four SE courses in History/Chemistry, s/he will be awarded the degree of B.A. with History/B. Sc. with Chemistry respectively.

COURSE STRUCTURE

Award of Degree

1. An undergraduate degree in Science discipline may be awarded if a student completes 4 core papers each in three disciplines of choice, 2 Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC), minimum 4 Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC) and 2 papers each from a list of Discipline Specific Elective papers based on three disciplines of choice selected above, respectively.
2. An undergraduate degree in Humanities/ Social Sciences/ Commerce may be awarded if a student completes 4 core papers each in two disciplines of choice, 2 core papers each in English and Hindi/MIL, respectively, 2 Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC), minimum 4 Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC), 2 papers each from a list of Discipline Specific Elective Papers based on the two disciplines of choice selected above, respectively, and 2 papers from the list of Generic Elective papers.
3. A regular candidate shall have to undergo the prescribed courses of study in the college for a period not less than three academic years (and not more than five academic years), and shall have to pass the examinations prescribed and fulfil such conditions as have been prescribed thereof.
4. For the degree (B.A./ B. Sc./ B. Com.), the student will have to cumulate a minimum of 132 successful credit hours of coursework over a minimum of three and a maximum of five years from the date of admission.

ELIGIBILITY CONDITIONS (CBCS)

A pass in the Senior Secondary (+2) Examination (any academic stream) conducted by the H.P Board of School Education (or in case of Shashtri, pass in Prak Shashtri from Sanskrit Colleges affiliated to the HPU) or an examination accepted as equivalent thereto by the various bodies of the H.P.University.

1. An applicant who has passed the qualifying examination with science stream shall be given admission to B.Sc. Programme. An applicant who has passed the qualifying examination with commerce stream shall be given preference in admission to B. Com. Programme.
2. An applicant must not be more than 23 years of age (25 years for girl student only) on 01-07-2024. The upper age limit is raised to 26 years for S.C. and S.T. applicants. However, in case of overage applicants, the Vice Chancellor, H.P.University may allow a relaxation up to six months.
3. Only an applicant having passed 10+2 examination with English as one of the compulsory subjects from any Indian University/Board recognized by law can seek admission.
4. The candidates who have been placed under compartment in the 10+2 examination will not be admitted to the college.
5. Only those students who have passed in all subjects in 10+2 from the National Open School (Delhi) shall be admitted to B.A./B. Com. I subject to the minimum eligibility conditions stated above.
6. Initially all admissions shall be provisional and subject to the final approval by H.P. University.
7. Admission of a student is liable to be cancelled in case he/she furnishes incomplete/ wrong/ false information or in case of concealment of facts. Disciplinary action will also be taken against such a candidate.
8. Rules of admission are subject to change as per the Himachal Pradesh University notifications issued from time to time.

- iv. An applicant who fails to deposit the dues by the prescribed date and time shall forfeit her/his right to admission in the College and the seat shall be offered to the next applicant in the merit list for which the notices shall be displayed on the College notice board accordingly. - v. In case of a tie in selection, the candidate older in age will be given weightage.

IMPORTANT GUIDELINES AND ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA FOR ADMISSION TO UNDER-GRADUATE COURSES - BA, B.Sc., B.Com.

1. The eligibility criteria for admission to B.A, B.Com and B.Sc. in the first year is strictly as per the latest ordinances/guidelines/calendar notified by the HP University/Government.
2. As per notification No. HP Department of Education (2) Samkaksha (equivalence) R (205) 2015.17 dated 31.1.15 of Secy.HP Board of Education,Dharamshala – a student must have passed five subjects including English as compulsory subject at Senior Secondary (plus two) level.
3. Admission shall not be allowed in any case to the candidates with compartment at 10+2 level.
4. Admission given in the first year is provisional,subject to the confirmation by HP University.If the University cancels the admission of a candidate for whatever reason,the college will not be held responsible for it.
5. Admission will be on merit basis.
6. The students of National Institute of Open School (NIOS) who have passed all five subjects by securing requisite marks will be admitted.
7. The upper age limit for admission is 25 years for girls and 23 years for boys as on 1st July, 2024.Age relaxation of 2 years is allowed for SC/ST candidates.
8. (i) All government institutions of Higher Education and other Higher Education Institutions receiving aid from the Government shall reserve not less than five percent seats for person with benchmark disabilities.
(ii) The candidates with benchmark disabilities shall be given an upper age relaxation of five years for admission in institutions of Higher Education.
9.
 1. Visit college website www.gcarki.hp.gov.in
 2. Click on the online admission link/ student login to open it.
 3. Read all the guidelines and eligibility conditions provided in the college prospectus available on the website.
 4. Register yourself by clicking 'NEW REGISTRATION'/ SIGN UP tab, and note down username and password generated after registration for future reference . (Note: Provide your own working mobile No. and e-mail id only)
 5. Login into your account and fill the admission form.Fill all the details carefully and only as per documents (such as matriculation and 10+2).
 6. Upload your passport size photograph as well as other required documents. (Keep the soft copy of documents ready with size below 200 kb). Upload valid and correct documents only, otherwise your form

will be REJECTED.

7. Submit the form, pay registration/prospectus fee of Rs.50/- and download the PDF of the form for future reference.
8. After approval from the college admission committee, you will receive an email of approval, then pay fee online by clicking the tab 'PAY FEE'.
9. Download fee receipt and application/admission form, as you need to submit the same at the time of physical verification by concerned admission committee.
10. A student must appear in person on the day of admission/counselling and carry all original documents for verification.
11. Core I Subject will be given/decided at the time of admission. The dates of this verification will be notified by the H.P. University/Government.
12. **Documents required with the admission form for B.A./B.Com/B.Sc. 1st year :**
 - (i) One photograph has to be uploaded.
 - (ii) Three copies of latest passport size photograph.
 - (iii) Original Character Certificate and School/College Leaving Certificate of last institute attended.
 - (iv) Self-attested photocopies of :
 - a) Matriculation Certificate.
 - b) 10+2 Certificate (Internet copy will not be valid)
 - c) Migration Certificate for candidates who do not belong to H.P. Board/University.
 - d) ST/SC/OBC/Sports/Cultural/Handicapped/IRDP/BPL Certificate for those seeking relaxation in age/marks/fee etc.
 - e) Bonafide Himachali Certificate if applicable (for girls only).
 - f) Aadhar Card
 - (v) Form for gap year if there is break in continuity after last exam passed
 - (vi) Anti-Ragging form (to be downloaded from: [anti_ragging_affidavit.pdf](#))
 - (vii) Students with gap in Studies after 10+2 need to submit self declaration / Affidavit. Such Students also need to submit latest character certificate from the competent authority of their area.

NOTE: Take a print of the application form submitted online and attach all the documents uploaded while filling online form. All original certificates must be produced at the time of Admission/Counselling.

Change of Subject /Faculty

Change of subject/faculty is allowed only once and that too in the first semester within 15 days of the commencement of teaching provided

- He/she fulfils eligibility criteria
- Seats are available in the concerned subject

Hence, a student is expected to be very careful while exercising the option for the first time in order to save himself from inconvenience later.

Admission to B.A. /B.Sc. / B.com. II & III Year on Roll-on Basis

- i. Students of B.A. / B.Sc. / B.Com. II & III Year are required to submit the admission form complete in all respects to the Admission Committee concerned as per the details given at the inside of the title page.
- ii. Not with standing eligibility for admission, the Principal may refuse admission, if the conduct of a student has not been up to the mark during the previous semester/Year.
- iii. A student disqualified/expelled/rusticated by any College/university shall not be admitted to any course during the period of her disqualification. (HPU Ordinance No. 3.6)
- iv. The Principal reserves the right to refuse or cancel admission without assigning any reason.
- v. Original documents along with Photostat copies of School/Board/University certificates from Matriculation onwards to be attached.
- vi. Any gap (latest) in the academic career of an applicant must be supported by a documentary evidence/affidavit as the proof of her activities during the period of gap.
- vii. Bonafide Himachali Certificate for the exemption of tuition fee. (only girl students)
- viii. Character certificate

issued by a gazetted officer in the case of an ICDEOL candidate.

- ix. Submission of false information of any kind for the purpose of admission is a serious offence. Any such act will be viewed seriously, penal proceedings will be initiated and admission will be cancelled forthwith.
- x. All admissions are provisional unless regularised by the University and the College will assume no responsibility, in case, the University, for any reason whatsoever, does not approve the admission of a student.

I2. Documents required for admission to B.A./ B.Com/B.Sc. 2nd & 3rd year:

- (I) Certificate of the last examination passed / Admit Card of Previous Examination.
- (ii) Self-attested photocopy of registration certificate.
- (iii) Character certificate in case of migrating candidates.

I3. Admission through Migration:

- (I) A student wishing to migrate to GC Solan will be allowed only when seats are vacant in the subject and if subject combination is the same as offered by the college.
- (ii) Migration is allowed only in second and third year after declaration of the result.
- (iii) A student has to get consent on a prescribed proforma of the teachers and the Principal of his/her college and the college the student wishes to migrate to.
- (iv) A student will have to apply online for migration and get it approved from both the colleges.
- (v) If permission is granted by the university, then two migration certificates are to be obtained from H.P. University. One of these is meant for the old college and second for the new one. A migrating student has to submit the following documents with the migration certificate:
 - a) Attendance of the subjects.
 - b) Statement of credit earned under CCA.
 - c) Original Character Certificate from the Principal of college last attended.
 - d) Admission will be given during the time period provided by the H.P. University.
 - e) A student migrating to GC Solan shall have to pay admission-fee afresh, but the monthly fee will be charged from the month of joining the new college.

Rules of Migration :

- 1. A candidate must fill the online migration form on HPU website.
- 2. After this, the form will be twice verified by the college.
- 3. The college where migration is sought will twice verify the form
- 4. Final verification will be done by HPU (Registration & Migration branch)
- 5. Fee of Rs 500 shall have to be deposited through online mode.
- 6. Print out of this migration certificate to be downloaded through HPU website and submitted in the college.

NOTE:

- 1. The character certificate should have been issued within the last six months.
- 2. In case of a private /gap year student the character certificate should be issued by Gazetted class-I officer/ Panchayat.
- 3. On the appointed day, go to the Library, show your admission form at the counter and get your College Identity-Cum- Library Card issued. In case of any difficulty, contact the Principal or any teacher for guidance and help.

- 2. The name will be struck off the rolls after consecutive six days' absence. Readmission must be taken within one week after the name is struck off.**
- 3. If the name is struck off the rolls thrice, the admission stands automatically cancelled.**

Fines & Penalties

- In case, a student does not deposit her dues on the dates notified, her name will be struck off from the College rolls at the end of the month.
- The name of a student shall also be struck off from the college rolls, if she remains absent without sanctioned leave for continuous 10 days or more.
- If the name of a student is struck off, she must be accompanied by her parent or guardian at the time of readmission.
- Once the name is struck off, the student must seek readmission within seven days.
- Every student will have to procure no dues certificate from College/Library/ Concerned Science Department/ N.S.S. / Sports/ College Canteen/ Fee Clerk etc. if He/She wants to leave the college.
- The library security deposited at the time of first admission will lapse if a student does not apply for refund within one year of leaving the college.
- In case a student does not appear in House Examination, He/She will be charged with fine of Rs. 50/- per paper.

Half Fee Concession: A concession of 50% in tuition fee will be admissible to only one of the siblings, provided they are boys, or only those girls who are not Bonafide Himachalis.

SCHEME OF EXAMINATION

Credit determination:

An undergraduate program degree in Humanities / Commerce may be awarded if a student completes 4 core papers, each in two disciplines of choice, 2 core papers each in English and MIL respectively, 2 Ability Enhancement compulsory courses (AECC), minimum 4 Skill Enhancement courses) SEC, 2 papers each from a list of Discipline specific Elective papers based on the two disciplines of choice selected above, respectively and two papers from the list of Generic Elective (GE) papers. BA / B.Com degree will be awarded if the student acquires 132 credits.

Evaluation System:

All courses involve an evaluation system of students that has the following components:

1. Continuous Comprehensive Assessment (CCA) accounting for 30% of the final grade that a student gets in a course. 30% assessment will be determined on the bases of class room attendance (out of 5 marks), Midterm (Minor) Test (out of 15 marks), Assignments / Seminars (out of 10 Marks).
2. A student will have to attend at least 75% lectures/Tutorials/Practicals. A student having less than 75% attendance will not be allowed to appear in the End semester examination.
3. Classroom Attendance Incentive: The incentive for the classroom attendance (for those participating in Co- curricular activities, 25% will be added to per cent attendance) will be awarded CCA marks as follows:
 - 75% but <80% 1 mark
 - 80% but <85% 2 marks
 - 85 % but <90% 3 marks
 - 90 % but <95% 4 marks
 - 95% and above 5 marks
4. End Semester Examination will be accounting for the remaining 70% of the final grade that a student gets in a course. The End Semester Examination will be of three hours' duration and will be covering the whole syllabus of the course. Odd semester examination will be in the month of November/December and for the even semester, it will be in the month of May/June.

BACHELOR OF COMPUTER APPLICATIONS (BCA)

About the Course

Bachelor of Computer Applications (BCA) is three years under graduate course spread over six semesters under self financing scheme. It is a three-year degree course leading to the award of the degree of Bachelor of Computer Applications of Himachal Pradesh University. The total number of seats in BCA Course is 20. The distribution of seats is as under:

Basis of Admission

- The admission to BCA-I Year shall be made on the basis of merit.
- Separate merit lists shall be prepared for subsidized category and non-subsidized category.
- The 10 subsidized seats shall be filled-in first and the remaining 10 seats in self-financing category shall be filled after all the seats in subsidized category are filled.
- NRIs/NRI sponsored candidates can apply for admission only in the non-subsidized category.
- There is no provision of reservation of any kind in the non- subsidized category.

Admission to subsidized seats shall be subject to the roster for reservation of seats for various categories as per rules of H.P. University.

Mode of Selection

The admission to BCA course will be made on the basis of merit of the qualifying examination. As per H.P. University rules 75% seats will be filled out of the candidates who have passed their 10+2 examination from the school situated in Himachal Pradesh irrespective of the Board. Remaining 25% seats will be filled on all India basis. Other reservation rules of H.P. University shall be applicable.

Eligibility

Candidates who have passed 10+2 examination from H.P. Board/CBSE/ICSE or any other examination considered equivalent to 10+2, by the Himachal Pradesh University, Shimla, with 40% Marks (35% marks for SC/ST category), shall be eligible.

Maximum age limit for admission to BCA course is 21 years for general category, 24 years for SC/ST category and 23 years for girl candidates, as on the 1st July of the year concerned. The Vice Chancellor may permit age relaxation up to maximum of three months.

ADMISSION PROCEDURE

Step: 1

The hard copy of the Application form filled in online, with the following documents enclosed, should be submitted in the College on or before 12 July 2024.

- One attested photocopy of Matriculation certificate as a proof of date of birth.
- One attested photocopy of 10+2 certificate.
- Character-cum-school leaving certificate (issued by the Principal of the institution last attended for regular students or by a gazetted officer in case of private candidates) in original.
- The character certificate should have been issued within the last 6 months on the day of submission of application. Migration certificate in original for those candidates who have done 10+2 from School Boards other than H.P. Board, Dharamshala. NRIs/NRI sponsored candidates & foreign nationals are eligible only for Non- subsidized seats.

Step: 2

- A list of shortlisted candidates shall be displayed on the college notice board.
- Shortlisted candidates shall have to deposit the dues, after getting their certificates verified and admission approved from the admission committee.
- University Registration form is to be filled and a copy each of Matriculation and 10+2 certificate is to be attached. Migration certificate, in original, is to be attached with the registration form. Library cum identity card will be issued from the library to a student on the production of fee receipt and library membership form.

SCHEME OF EXAMINATION

The pass percentage in each subject will be 40%.

ii) Practical Examination Max. Marks: 50 INT.:15, EXT.:35; Duration: 3 hours.

Practical exam will be conducted by the external examiner from the panel submitted to The Chairman, Computer Science Department, and Himachal Pradesh University and duly approved by the university authority/evaluation branch, Himachal Pradesh University, Shimla.

(iii) **Project Work:**

In the 3rd Year the student has to develop one project, which will be evaluated by the external examiner from the panel submitted to The Chairman, Computer Science Department, Himachal Pradesh University, and duly approved by the university authority/evaluation branch, Himachal Pradesh University, Shimla on the following

ROLL-ON ADMISSION

Admission to 3rd Semester and 3rd Year of B.C.A. shall be on Roll-on basis. Without waiting for their University result, the students must fill in the admission form, attach relevant documents and seek admission to the next higher class as per the admission schedule of H.P. University.

Documents Required:

- Certificates of lower classes.
- Four passport-size photographs (To be pasted on the admission form, library membership form, identity card, Bio-data card).
- Certificate as proof of SC/ST status, Excellence in sports, Excellence in cultural activities, Physical Disability Important Instructions:
- All the students of B.C.A. III are directed to pay the college fee under the roll-on system well within the notified dates. No one will be permitted to attend the classes without depositing the prescribed fee.
- Lectures attended under roll-on system will also be counted for determining eligibility to appear in the final examination.
- All admissions under roll-on system are provisional and the admission of a student who fails to fulfill eligibility criteria after the declaration of the University result will stand automatically cancelled.
- It is mandatory for all the students getting admission based on roll-on system to get their admission regularized within ten days of the declaration of the University result.

Eligibility conditions for regularization of admission:

B.C.A.III

A candidate should have passed at least 50% of papers of B.C.A. 2nd Year Examination and all the papers of 1st Year Examination.

N. B.: As per decision of the Academic Council in its meeting held on 02.04.2011 vide item no.9, the Vice-chancellor has been pleased to allow promotion of a candidate who has passed/cleared all papers of 1st year and 50% of second year to take admission/ promotion in 3rd year. Further it was also decided that a candidate who appears in supplementary examination will also be promoted to the next year as well as in the final year who has got admission in BCA and qualifies 50% or more than 50% papers after the declaration of re-evaluation result/supplementary result. The concession is admissible from the academic session 2010-11.

POST GRADUATE DIPLOMA IN COMPUTER APPLICATION (PGDCA)

PGDCA is a one year diploma course split over two semesters, leading to the award of Diploma in Computer Applications, from Himachal Pradesh University. The admission to the course is open under two Categories:

Graduation in any discipline or equivalent of any University established by law in India with 50% marks (45% marks in case of Scheduled Caste/Scheduled Tribe).

Certificate as proof of SC/ST status, Excellence in sports, Excellence in cultural activities, Physical Disability.

Valid character-cum-College leaving certificate (issued by the Principal of the institution last attended for regular students or by a gazetted officer in case of private candidates) in original.

Migration certificate in original for those candidates who have Graduated from a University other than H.P. University.

Step:2

University Registration form is to be filled and a copy each of Matriculation, 10+2 and Graduation certificate is to be attached by those candidates who have done Graduation from a University other than H.P. University.

Migration certificate, in original, is to be attached with the registration form. Admission will finally be approved by the Principal.

Students are also required to fill in library membership form which is not to be attached with the admission form.

LEAVE RULES FOR STUDENTS

- i. A student can proceed on leave with the prior permission of the Tutor concerned obtained on the application form but it must be signed by her parent or guardian.
- ii. Once the leave is sanctioned, a student is required to inform the teachers concerned.
- iii. The Tutor concerned can sanction leave up to 7 days while leave for more than 7 days will be sanctioned by the Principal.
- iv. Leave on account of illness of more than 7 days, must be accompanied by a Medical Certificate/Registration slip.
- v. A student may proceed on any kind of leave but she must deposit his/her fees/fines on the appointed day and date. Otherwise her admission will stand cancelled. Similarly, she is also required to return the book on the due date.
- vi. Students, who represent college in various inter-college games or other competitions, will have to get their leave sanctioned from the Dean & noted by the subject teachers concerned before their departure for the event.
- vii. No leave will be granted during MidTerm Tests.
- viii. Leave application duly sanctioned must be dropped in the leave box installed in the college premises.

LIBRARY & ITS RULES

The college provides library and reading room facility to all its students. It has a fairly good collection of books & has different sections for text books and reference books. The library subscribes to as many as 5 newspapers, 10 magazines and 5 specialized journals regularly. Students are encouraged to avail library facility during working hours on all working days. Rules

- vi. Student is responsible for the book as soon as it is issued. In case a book is defaced / damaged in any way, the book is to be replaced by him/her.

Clippings of advertisements for different posts/training programmes, from various newspapers, are also displayed on the notice board for the benefit of students. Resource persons from government and private agencies are also invited. Many national/multinational companies flock the campus to pick up the best talent available.

Women's Grievances & Redressal Cell

This cell has been constituted to achieve the objective of gender equality by making the girls aware of their rights and duties. Gender disparity manifests itself in various forms and the underlying causes for the discrimination are related to social and economic structure, which is based on informal and formal norms, and practices. CODE OF CONDUCT AND DISCIPLINE FOR STUDENTS

The College shall have the jurisdiction over the conduct of its students and to take cognizance of all acts of misconduct, including incidents of ragging or otherwise which may take place in the College campus. Every student will have to observe the following Code of Conduct and Discipline in the college campus:

1. He/she shall be regular in classes. The name of a student will be struck off from the college rolls, if he/she remain absent without sanctioned leave for continuous 10 days.
2. Readmission must be sought within seven days of name struck off and the student must be accompanied by his/her parent(s) or guardian.
3. A student without an identity card, duly signed by the Principal, is deemed an outsider and will not be allowed to enter the college premises.

5. Participating in following activities will invite disciplinary action by the college administration:

 - b) Loitering aimlessly in the corridors, making noise or disturbing / disrupting classes.
 - c) Smoking, taking drugs/alcohol, chewing tobacco, spitting in the campus.
 - d) Indulging in any rash/unbecoming behavior with the students or the administration.
 - e) Damaging /defacing the property of the institute or an individual.
 - f) Writing obscenities/dirty words on black boards, walls or furniture; banging doors or furniture etc.
 - g) Pasting posters on the walls or notices on the Notice Board without prior permission.
 - h) Interacting with media, in any form whatsoever, on behalf of the College, without the permission of the College authorities.
 - i) Bringing outsiders/miscreants/anti-social elements to the campus.
 - j) Using mobile phones in the campus, except in the space specified (college canteen).
 - k) Parking vehicles in area earmarked for the college staff.
 - l) Rash driving, playing loud music in the campus that may cause any inconvenience to others.
6. Students must deposit their dues on the dates notified otherwise their names will be struck off from the college rolls at the end of that month.
7. Students are expected to use 'social media' carefully and responsibly.
8. Submission of false information of any kind for admission or scholarship etc is a serious offence. Penal proceedings will be initiated and admission will be cancelled forthwith.
9. All the students are expected to be readily available for social service and other college activities.
10. All the students will be the ambassadors of the college outside the campus too, so they should be courteous.

HOSTEL ADMISSION:

Govt. G.C.Arki will provide a hostel facility to female students from this session.Admission to the hostel will strictly be on a merit basis subject to the prescribed reservation policy of the government.Admission to hostel will commence after the admission process is complete.

ELIGIBILITY CONDITIONS (in brief):

- Only those students will be considered for admission to the hostel who have deposited their entire college fees and have permanent residences beyond a radius of 20 Km from G. C.Arki.A certificate to this effect is compulsory.
- As per the rules of H.P. Govt. seats are reserved for SC, Backward classes, IRDP, Physically Handicapped candidates, wards of Army Personnel, Ex-Servicemen, outstanding Sports Persons, and students who have excelled in cultural activities. Only those students who seek admission to the College before the expiry of the admission date (without a late fee) are eligible to be admitted to the Hostel.
- Only those students will be considered for the sports quota, who have participated in the District / State/National level tournaments. Original certificates will be verified at the time of admission. (In case of a tie, trials may be held.)

- Only those students who have secured 1st, 2nd or 3rd position in District/State/National level sports / cultural events will be considered for the quota meant for outstanding students in Sports/cultural activities. It will be mandatory for these students admitted against sports and cultural quotas to participate in sports/cultural events.
- All the students seeking admission to the hostel are required to deposit the Hostel Admission Form in the college office on or before the last date of admission. (Without late fee)
- Forms submitted in the office are scrutinized by the hostel committee and a merit-wise list of the students is prepared and displayed on the notice board.
- At the beginning of the session all the vacant seats in the hostel, are allotted to the students based on merit in their respective category
- In case, any seat falls vacant, it is allotted to the next student on the merit list.
- The students who seek admission to the hostel are required to compulsorily participate in college activities like sports, cultural activities, N.S.S. / N.C.C. etc.
- If any seat falls vacant during the session, it is filled strictly following the merit list prepared at the beginning of the session.

DOCUMENTS/ CERTIFICATES REQUIRED FOR ADMISSION:

The following certificates issued by the respective competent authority, are required for admission to hostels

- A medical fitness certificate issued by a medical officer from a Govt. hospital is mandatory.
- SC/ST certificate issued by a first-class magistrate.
- Handicapped certificate issued by C.M.O.
- District/State/National Level participation in sports certificate issued by the respective authority.
- An undertaking is to be given by the Parent that his/her ward does not suffer from any physical or mental illness, and if, she develops any physical or mental illness or abnormality of behaviour during her stay in the college hostel which may cause hindrance in the daily routine of co-boarders, the college authorities reserve the right to cancel the allotment of room in the hostel to her.
- An undertaking is to be given by the Parent that his/her ward will not indulge in any act that comes in the category of ragging.
- Residence proof, signed by a competent authority, specifying distance from GC Arki.
- Information regarding local guardians needs to be provided on a separate form along with a passport-size photograph of the guardian, and his/her specimen signature and contact number duly verified by the parent.

Note: A separate document dealing with detailed admission procedure, rules & regulations, fee structure etc. will be prepared by the Hostel Committee. Students seeking admission to the hostel can obtain this document from the Hostel Committee.
